- Communicate Effectively: Develop crisis communication skills for both internal and external stakeholders, including the media.
- Navigate Legal and Ethical Challenges: Comprehend the legal and ethical aspects of security, making informed decisions during emergencies.
- Demonstrate Practical Proficiency: Showcase their abilities through full-scale emergency response drills.
